





HOW TO USE

STEP 1 Check your **WASTE** is WHAT CAN GO IN THE COMPOST.

STEP 2 Make sure your **WASTE** is in small pieces (**chopped, crushed, ripped up, shredded**) to help it break down.

STEP 3 Place your **WASTE** in where it says **COMPOST HERE**.

STEP 4 **OPTIONAL**

Add a scoop of Browns from the Browns Storage Bin (sources of carbon like straw, wood chips, dry leaves) to help the **WASTE** break down better.

STEP 5 Close the **COMPOST** lid.

WHAT CAN GO IN THE COMPOST



✓ Fruit and vegetables (chopped)



✓ Eggshells (crushed)



✓ Egg cartons (ripped up)




✓ Tea leaves or paper tea bags



✓ Dried plants or leaves

- ✓ Cooked food
- ✓ Coffee grounds
- ✓ Lawn clippings
- ✓ Brown paper or cardboard (ripped up)
- ✓ Newspapers (ripped up)
- ✓ Untreated woodchips or sawdust
- ✓ Matte office paper (shredded)

WHAT CAN'T GO IN THE COMPOST



✗ Meats or fish



✗ Cooking oils or fats



✗ Face masks



✗ Plastic wrappers or packaging



✗ Dairy products



✗ Compostable or biodegradable plastics

- ✗ Dog, cat or other animal droppings
- ✗ Tea bags with synthetic materials
- ✗ Fruit stickers, labels or ties
- ✗ Glossy magazines or coloured paper
- ✗ Nappies or wipes
- ✗ Any treated or sealed timber items
